A Knowledge Management Approach to the Development of Appropriate Technology, with a focus on Sustainable land-based projects

The theme of our first international conference on 'Appropriate Technology' is designed to:

- Facilitate research on the management, assessment, archiving and tracking of appropriate technology concepts and projects through the use of state of the art knowledge management theories and practices
- 2) Focus on projects related to increasing the productivity of land-based projects in a sustainable fashion, while being inclusive of all areas related to appropriate technology.

Background

Underdeveloped countries throughout the world have a majority of their population involved in land-based economy, primarily farming, but also ranching and mining. Despite this economic emphasis, most of these countries are importers of agricultural products. This is a problem of low productivity. Due to insufficient technology, little of the natural resources excavated from mining are processed locally. A multi-discipline investigation of the most appropriate technology to use to increase land-based productivity is in order. To be effective this process of technology implementation must be sustainable, and culturally and environmentally sensitive.

Language

The official language of the conference shall be English.

Format of Papers

While the focus of this first conference is on land-reform oriented projects, we are seeking quality papers on all appropriate technology related topics. All accepted papers will be part of a copyrighted conference proceedings publication that will be distributed at the conference. They also will be posted on our website.

A page limit of 8 pages has been set. Additional pages will require a page fee of \$100 USD per page. Authors can submit multiple papers. At least one co-author must register in advance of the deadline for the paper to be processed for the proceedings. All papers will be peer reviewed and a summary of the review results will be forwarded to the first author.
